- Front page of DLA letter (no specific rate required)
- Front page of Attendance letter (no specific rate required)
- Receipt of Personal Independence Payment (PIP)
- Evidence of being severely sight impaired
- CredAbility Access Card (+1 category requirement)
- A recognised Assistance Dog ID Card

Parking & Travel Information

There is a limited number of Blue Badge Parking available. This must be pre-booked via the Access Officer and is subject to availability. TFL Bus 210 drops off a short distance to the site entrance.

Ground Conditions

The concert will take place outside, mainly on grass, so the ground conditions may be affected by the weather. Although, there are paths around the site, some of these are quite steep and bumpy. We therefore do not recommend them for wheelchair users or customers with limited mobility. A wheelchair accessible buggy is available to assist disabled customers plus one accompanying person from the Access Parking area to the arena before the concert begins and back, when it finishes.

Viewing Platforms

There will be a viewing platform for disabled customers and booking is essential as space is limited. Due to limited space only 1 person can accompany disabled customers on the platform. Wheelchair accessible toilets will be located at the viewing platform and there will be chairs on the platform.

There is a limit to the number of spaces available on the viewing platforms. Booking is essential via access@gcelive.com and it is advisable to check availability before booking your ticket.

Wheelchair Accessible Toilets

There will be wheelchair accessible toilets located at all the toilet blocks and at the viewing platform.

Assistance Dogs

Assistance Dogs are welcome. Please let the Access Officer know if you are bringing an Assistance Dog, so that we can put a dog spending area on site.

Strobe Lighting

Strobe lighting might be used during performances.

Medical Services

There will be a First Aid point located within the arena.

Lowered Counters

There will be lowered counters at the onsite bars.
